At WellCare, our mission is one of service—to help our members live better, healthier lives.

We believe healthy communities help people make healthy choices. That's why WellCare supports organizations that serve our members and the communities in which they live. We do this through corporate sponsorships as well as contributions from the WellCare Community Foundation.

WellCare Corporate Sponsorships

WellCare considers sponsorships from a wide range of organizations and encourages creativity and innovation to develop partnerships that bring value to both our members and our associates. Specifically, WellCare considers sponsorships that:

- Create value for WellCare
- Provide participation and/or volunteer opportunities for WellCare associates
- Create unique and memorable experiences for WellCare members
- Support the local communities WellCare serves

WellCare Community Foundation

The WellCare Community Foundation fosters and promotes the health and well-being of medically underserved populations and their communities. Each year, the foundation makes donations to organizations and programs that provide critical services and support to people and communities embodying its mission.

The WellCare Community Foundation looks for opportunities where funding can have a clear, measurable impact on the community, generally through program support.

Criteria for Eligible Organizations

Contributions are made only to qualified, federal tax-exempt 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations, as defined by the Internal Revenue Service Code, through the WellCare Community Foundation. Contributions are restricted to nonprofit organizations serving local residents in areas in which WellCare has a presence. Contributions may not be linked, explicitly or implicitly, to an agreement to recommend, refer or arrange for business with WellCare.

The organization must meet one of the following criteria to ensure they align with WellCare's mission:

- Helps low-income families and underserved populations
- Works to enhance the health, well-being, education, safety and quality of life of people in the communities WellCare serves
- Improves the vitality of communities and people under WellCare's care—from infants to the elderly and people with disabilities to struggling families

The WellCare Community Foundation generally does not support:

- Organizations that do not align with WellCare's mission or values
- Individuals
- Religious organizations (including church restorations)
- Labor, fraternal and veterans organizations (including fraternal orders of police/firefighters)



- Political organizations or projects
- Operating deficits
- Governmental and quasi-governmental public agencies or organizations
- Endowments
- Trips and tours, including transportation costs
- Payment on bank loans
- Private foundations or trusts
- Historic preservation
- Public or private education institutions
- Organizations that have a primary function or project of advocacy, lobbying or litigation
- Organizations that practice or promote discriminatory, exclusionary or partisan policies
- Organizations that have or create a perceived or actual conflict of interest with WellCare Health Plans, Inc.

Priority is given to those projects which:

- Provide direct service to low- or moderate-income populations
- Are one year in duration
- Demonstrate a plan for long-term sustainability and potential to be replicated
- Are focused on addressing a specific unmet need or issue

Funding Restrictions

In keeping with its diversity and inclusion policy, WellCare does not fund organizations which discriminate based on:

- Age
- Race
- Color
- Sex
- Religion
- National Origin
- Disability
- Family Status
- Receipt of Public Assistance
- Sexual Orientation
